Overlooking the Florida's Intracoastal Waterway, this convertible room can be all things to people. By day, it's a TV room, featuring natural African wenge wood cabinets (and stunning Martin Pierce drawer pulls) that hide a huge storage space. By night, the oversized sofa pulls put to increase sleeping quarters, over a huge rug that reads Can't Buy Me Love.



While the acoustic-rate wall coverings and two-toned American Leather custom luxury chair take pride of place, the real design story is in creating the challenging combination of alternating high gloss and matte finishes on the ceiling panels and screen surround. Oversized storage space is hidden behind the glossy, quarter-cut rosewood panels.
